

Fish Recipe

Sometimes you go to the larder and your "go to" ingredients are gone. Such was the case when I had a couple of steelhead fillets to barbeque a few nights ago. I "made do" with what I had and the result was so awesome, it had to be shared.

Ingredients

- ? 1/4 teaspoon freshly ground pepper
- ? 1/4 cup butter, clarified and cooled
- ? 1/2 red grapefruit, juiced
- ? 1/3 cup Kraft Poppy Seed Dressing
- ? 2-4 steelhead fillets (skin on)
- ? cooking spray

Instructions

Pre-heat grill on high.

Position the steelhead fillets skin side up and lightly coat with cooking spray.

Turn grill down to medium to medium high.

Place fillets skin side down on grill.

Sprinkle pepper evenly over fillets and press into flesh with spatula.

Cover grill and cook for 5-6 minutes or until fillets flake easily.

While fish is on grill, blend remaining ingredients well by hand (mixers make it too foamy).

Take steelhead fillets from grill, drizzle with dressing/butter/juice sauce and serve immediately.

This is wonderful served with a green vegetable such as asparagus, bok choy or green beans.

If you need a starch go with wild or brown rice with raisins and diced apple thrown in for the last 5 minutes of cooking.

New Walleye Reg's

Please be reminded that the walleye season on the Thames River will be closed from the second Saturday in March until the second Saturday in April.

The only exception is an open seaon from the downstream side of the Middlemiss Bridge in Chatham to Lake St. Clair.

Be sure to check the MNR Web site or other MNR publications before you go fishing. Reg's can change and as always, ignorance of the law does not exempt you from punishment.

Work Parties

Two Stream Rehabilitation work parties, scheduled last month, were called off because of little or no attendance. Obstructions throughout Komoka Creek that require immediate attention remain to be addressed. Discussions at the March 12th Annual General Meeting will take place to determine what folks need to show up and participate in these work parties.

We will be applying for funds from DFO to make some signage to put on Komoka Creek. These signs will display our partnerships as well as Identifying Komoka Creek as a nursery habitat improvement project.

Trout Committee

John Schwindt has written a DFO proposal for identifying potential areas for stocking or re-stocking brook trout throughout the Upper Thames watershed. He sent an email to Randy Bailey asking if we would be interested in trying brook trout in our trout hatchery. If we were willing, John would try to find a few local sources for harvesting eggs as part of the project. Chances are this won't get funding but John thought he would give us a "heads up" just in case.

John is also up for helping us collect rainbow eggs in this month with his electroshocking equipment. In the meantime, we will also be asking the MNR for a permit for rainbow eggs from Sault Ste. Marie as a backup plan. The Trout Committee Co-Chairs, Dave Jeffries and Bob Pearson, can be contacted for more information.

Trout Committee

Walleye Hatchery plans are still in the works pending the award of the \$100,000.00 to the Walleye Task Force. The OFAH and the TRAA will be trying to establish a rearing pond to compliment the hatchery at Fanshawe Lake. The PGT (put-grow-take) project is to be used to enhance the walleye fishery in Fanshawe Lake and hopefully the Thames River as well.

In related news, in John Swindt's email to Randy Bailey (see Trout Committee above) he stated furthermore that he might also try to get a permit to have look at North Thames spawning walleye this spring to see how plentiful and accessible they are for future egg collections.
